JOURNALISTIC SOURCES

A source is a person who relays information to a journalist.

RELIABLE



THE SOURCE IS CLEARLY **IDENTIFIED. BUT HE OR SHE CAN REMAIN ANONYMOUS UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS.**

UNRELIABLE





IDENTIFIED OR IS IMPRECISE. FOR EXAMPLE: "SCIENTISTS SAY THAT...".



THE SOURCE IS RELEVANT TO THE SUBJECT RAISED AND HAS **RECOGNIZED EXPERTISE.**



THE ASSERTIONS **ARE CONFIRMED BY** OTHER SOURCES.
